LETTER TO PRESIDENTS ANS SECRETARIES

Once again I congratulate all presidents and secretaries of clubs who have been selected to serve in the coming year.

Presidents, you are in charge, you must guide your clubs through the problems of the coming year, the efficient running of your clubs and their development depend on you. You have, to help you in your task, the presidents' handbook and the procedure manual. You should refer to these frequently and attentively.

Secretaries, you are responsible for the club's administration. You are presidents' righthand men and must ensure that the clubs operate correctly. You are responsible for the relations with the district governor, with the regional office and with the head office of Rotary International in EVANSTON. You must ensure that the club committees operate effectively and that they are properly guided by their chairmen. You have the blue secretaries' handbook to help you fulfill your responsibilities, you should consider this to be your bible.

Your clubs must prepare the four committees, one for each avenue of service. These committees are a vital part of club life and for this reason they must be srtong active and enterprising. Each member of the club should be asked to serve on a committee and should be given a responsibility in accordance with his personal aptitudes and tastes. The committees should meet regularly. It is important that the leaflets of information and advice for each committee should be distributed without delay so that they can plan their work and their year's activities.

On the question of finance, it is of the utmost importance that each club prepares a budget for the coming year as early as possible. A budget properly prepared will ensure that sufficient funds are available for the clubs' running expenses and in particular for the use of the community service committee. Admission fees for new members and the annual subscriptions must be kept at a reasonable level.

I set out below my propositions as to how we can best achieve the goals which have been given by President Carlos Canseco:

1. At club level

- motivate club members so that they participate more actively,
- ensure a membership of at least 30 members in each club,
- ensure that each club has at lesat one Paul Harris Fellow in 1984-1985,
- the creation of at least one rotaract club in each country,
- establish a direct contact between each club in the district with a club in a developed country,
- promote the anti polio campaign.

2. At district level

- Develop and improve effectiveness of the district organisation,
- improve communications between clubs and the district governor,
- ensure a minimum menbership in the district of 1,250 members,
- raise the number of clubs in the district to 40 by:
 - . forming clubs in countries where Rotary International is not yet represented,
 - . creation of new clubs in each country in the district especially aiming at forming a second club in countries where there is so far only one club.

I shall develop the above recommendations at district level in future letters and prepare a timetable for its implementation.

The task we are facing is not easy but we have all received the training necessary to achieve it right from the first day we became members of Rotary International.

For the period you are in office you should work to boost the confidence of your club members to revive their enthusiasm for the rotary movement and their desire to serve. All your efforts should be aimed at marking this year a memorable one and that when it is over you should have the satisfaction of a job well done.

You can count on my total support and I look forward to meeting you all during my official visits.

Do not allow the weight of your responsability to overcome you and remember always the following lines taken from the Bible:
"You are the salt of the earth, if the salt should lose its savour, with what shall it be salted?".

I wish you all a very successful year.

The one who has planted a tree before his death, has not lived in vain because the tree will grow and give shelter and fruits to those who will born tomorrow. After 10 years of existence the 910 district has owned his letters of nobility and a appreciable experience in rotary mater.

Therefore it is time for the rotarians of our district to lay out a positive deed for the future of the rotary international and mostly for the benefit of africains of today and tomorrow. That is why I am inviting all the clubs of the district to use the ardour and enthousiasm of the youth to create a project which will characterize the district like the other districts of the 158 countries and geographical regions which compose the rotary international. Whence the object of the competition defined below.

COMPETITION OF THE BEST PROJECT IN KEEPING
WITH THE THEME OF THE R. I. FOR THE YEAR 1984-1985

Orientation: Specially african project of the 910 district to discover a new world of service and mark the R.I. with its stamp in a permanent manner.

Jury: Past Governor and nominated Governors, presided by the Governor on duty.

Opening: August 1984.

Closing: January 1985.

Price: Title Paul Harris Fellow, confered by the district.

Project: to be presented through the clubs.

GENERAL INFORMATIONS

- 1. The provisional Rotary Club in OUAGADOUGOU was officially admitted to Rotary International on 1st June 1984. This was announced on 3rd June 1984 during the opening ceremony of the 1984 Annual Congress held in BIRMINGHAM.
- 2. The NOUAKCHOTT Club which should have been part of the new District 901 which is made up of clubs from North Africa will perhaps be maintained in District 910. I have already spoken of this to President Carlos Canseco at the request of the club who expressed the desire to stay in District 910 at the District Conférence held on 7th April 1984 in LOME. This request was approved by the participants at the District Conference.
- 3. The President Carlos Canseco has introduced a certificate which will be given to new members enrolled in the new 1984-1985 year. Each District Governor has received five certificates signed by Président Canseco and these certificates will be given to the first five Rotarians enrolled in the District in the new year. I would ask all club presidents to let me have the names and details of new members introduced into their clubs in July 1984.
 - 4. A list of Rotarians with a responsibility at District level has been sent to the regional office in ZURICH. Each one of these officiers will receive the documentation necessary to help him carry out his functions.
 - 5. In order to avoid expensive travel costs for clubs, I will be travelling during July 1984 to meet club presidents for information sessions. These will not be my official visits.
 - 6. The African Goodwill Conference of the President of Rotary International is now called the African Conference of Rotary International. The first conference with this new name will be held in ABIDJAN from 17th to 20th January 1985. This decision was taken at a meeting presided by Carlos Canseco held on 25th May at BOCA RATON.

CHOICE OF THE GOVERNOR CANDIDATE

PREAMBULE

The method of nominating the Governor candidate is determined by the interior regulations of the Rotary International in the 13th article pargraph 4, line a and b; paragraph 5 line a to h.

The non observation of the indications of the 13th article has led in the past to adopt more or less improvised practises leading to long discussions in a way that the Governor candidate was not chosen in an atmosphere of dignity in keeping with the principles of the rotary and necessary in consideration of the importance and the seriousness of the task.

The problem of precision and simplification of the designation procedure of the expected Governor candidates justifies this regulation project for the use of the district 910.

The election process of proposed candidatures at the very conference provided for in line e, 13th article paragraph 5 and the designation process by vote by mail provided for in line g are excluded. The nomination of the Governor candidate will take place by means of an appointment commission as provided in line f.

Appointment commission: An appointment commission of the Governor candidate has been established. This appointment commission is composed: of the Gouvernor in charge, of all past Governors, of the appointed Governor of 3 past presidents of clubs nominated by rotation each year according to alphabetical order of the countries.

The functionning rules of this commission are those of the manual of procedure.

Proposition of candidatures: The district Governor will send out a circular inviting all clubs willing to do so, to submit their propositions of candidatures. These candidatures will have to be forwarded to him in the form of a resolution passed during a regular meeting of the club certified conformable by the secretary at last 3 months before the district conference.

Candidatures can only be presented by district club with their contributions in order towards the Rotary International and the district fund. The proposals of candidatures arrived in time will be transmitted to the appointment commission thanks to the Gaustian

Choice of the Gouvernor candidate: The Governor candidate will be chosen according to the dispositions of the manual of procedure.

Adopted in LOME on April 6, 1984 byy the District Conference.

CONSTITUTION AND MANAGEMENT OF DISTRICT FUND

- 1º/ District 910 of Rotary International has provided a fund role is to cover necessary expenses for good management and for the development of the district.
- separate the beginning of each rotarian year a budget is prepared by the appointed governor. This budget is previously studied by the appointed and the practising governor in collaboration with a commission of 3 members. This commission is nominated by the district for a 3 year period renewable by third each year. Renewals are made by designation of the governor, this budget is adressed to the presidents of the club 8 weeks before the district assembly.
- 3°/ This budget will be submitted for examination to the appointed presidents in session during the district assembly under the presidency of the practising governor. In order to be practicable this budget would have to receive approval of 3/4 of the appointed presidents present and voting.
- 4° 1 Contribution of clubs to the budget thus adopted will be determined by the above mentionned commission. Notification will be made by the practising governor to the presidents of the clubs.
- 5°/ Each club will have to have discharged his contribution no later than October 1st of the year for which the budget has been voted.
- 6° / Any club that will not pay his contribution will neither participate in the voting during the district meetings, nor present candidates to an eligible post.
- 7*/ The fund is essentially supplied by the contribution of the clubs as decided by the commission. The fund will also accept gifts and legacies from our corporation.
- 8° / The district fund will be strictly reserved to cover expenses different to those covered by the budget granted to the governor by the International Rotary.
